Wherever possible children should attend school every day.

What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence. Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters. If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival. If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day. Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you. Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned. If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a home visit.

**Your child's annual flu vaccination is now due.**

This vaccination programme is in place to help protect your child against flu. The vaccine will help prevent them catching the flu. Vaccinating your child will also help protect vulnerable friends and family by reducing the spread of flu.

The intra-nasal flu vaccine is the most effective protection for your child against flu.

If you decide you do not want your child to receive the flu vaccination, please complete a no consent form. (Still use the above link)

If in the past you have refused the intra-nasal flu vaccine due to porcine gelatine content, please follow the guidance on the flu consent form. The intramuscular (IM) flu vaccination can be given in school from year 7 upwards; younger years will be invited to receive it in one of our clinic venues. Contact the school aged immunisation team if you wish to arrange a clinic appointment.

Your child's school will be able to see if you have returned a consent form or not, they will not be able to access any personal information regarding you or your child.

If you have any queries regarding the online consent form or the Flu vaccine please contact the. North Cumbria Integrated Care School Aged Immunisation Service.

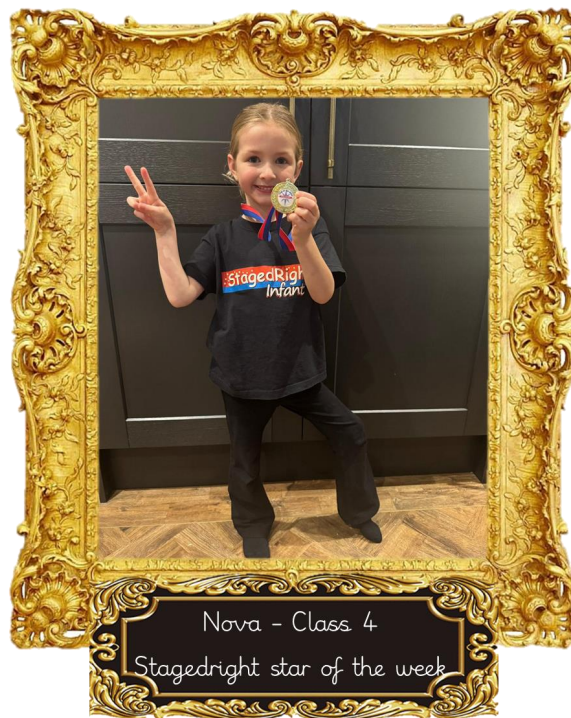
